HONEY MARKET UPDATES

- US honey crop is expected to be favorable; Smaller yield in the SE due to weather, but better in the Midwest
- European honey demand is down 10-20% due to inflation and post-COVID trends
- South American origins are winding down production and gearing up for the new season in early 2024
- Mexico highland honey harvest beginning soon; average season anticipated
- Smaller crop expected in Vietnam in 2024 due to anti-dumping activity and lack of global market options
- Good honey harvest in Canada for the first time in several years

ANTI-DUMPING UPDATE

- Mandatory respondents have been identified for Period of Review 1 (POR1) evaluation
- Vietnam petitioning the US government to be considered a market economy for anti-dumping purposes
- Ruling on the challenge to Critical Circumstances ruling is expected within the next month
